Making Music in Chicago!

IFRM Founder **Jim Whited's** dream of Fellowship Musicians performing at each RI Convention became a reality as 41,000 attendees heard the strains of music throughout the five-day convention.

Under Parade Float Chairman Curtis Reinhardt and Conductor Andy Anderson, festivities got off to a great start as singers and musicians entertained the crowd from IFRM's crepe-paper float as it twined its way around Chicago's Loop with 150 other parade entries.



The following day, World Choir Conductor, Chungsam Doh, directed over 150 singers at the Interfaith Service. IFRM member Annie Cleveland accompanied the World Choir who was joined by the harmony of the renowned 24-voice Tulsa Men of Note, directed by Cory Nickerson. After listening to Chungsam's original composition, "Celebrate Rotary", the audience joined in singing the stirring closing hymn, "Let There Be Peace on Earth."



Instrumentalists and vocalists shared their energies and musical talents throughout the convention at luncheons, district dinners, on-stage and at the IFRM Booth in the House of Friendship.

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Musical Highlights

IFRM member **Ester Hana** of Chicago recruited an amazing collection of Chicago area instrumental, vocal and dance performers that reflected the ethnic diversity and depth of talent. Performing on-stage in the House of Friendship throughout the convention, the musicians drew an increasing crowd of appreciative listeners.

Led by Rotarian **Tom McDermott**, the *Sinful Saints Dixieland Band* had toes tapping and bodies swaying to the distinctive rhythms of Dixieland jazz. Another crowd pleaser was the "Best of the West" **King'n Trio** quartet from Grand Junction, Colorado, who entertained the crowds with their renditions of popular American songs.



The *Calabash Chorale*, an all-Rotarian group of 15 vocalists and instrumentalists from St. Lucia Island, West Indies, sang and played calypso written by their manager and lead singer, **Malcolm Charles**.



And then there was the American premier of "The Rotarian Symphony", played by composer and classical pianist **Patrick Dheur** of Liege, Belgium, the melodic sounds of **Joyce Fritz**' golden flute, and the Sinatra-style baritone voice of new member, and frequent M.C., **PDG Ron Reynolds.**

The original skit, "Rotary: The Musical", written by **Bob Kapelke** of the Denver Rotary Club, met with a standing ovation. IFRM Musicians **Andy Anderson**, **Ken Halverson**, **Pam Wall**, and **Bill Pitzer** performed with eight of the original Denver cast.



Perhaps, however, the cacophony of music, laughing and fellowship that emanated from IFRM's Booth in the House of Friendship was the real highlight of this RI Convention.



Chungsam and Sunae Doh, Curtis Reinhardt, Bill Reinhardt, Andy Anderson, Doug Cleveland, and Susan DuPree responded to questions, passed out informational brochures, signed-up new IFRM members and somehow found time to join in with the singing. They truly personified the motto, Service Above Self—*Through Music*.
