Rotary World Choir Review


The debut of Rotary World Choir Director **Judith Walker** in Montreal, Canada, was applauded and appreciated by attendees at the R.I. Convention’s *Interfaith Service* in June, 2010.

“I just never expected the choir to sound so good,” exclaimed Judith. “After all, “she continued, “we only had one hour to practice together.”

However, it was Judith’s preparation of the choir that made the difference. Each singer who registered received the sheet music, a CD recording of his/her part (voice) for each song and pertinent notes for the program.



Additionally, Judith honored the cultural heritage of our host country with a sensitive bilingual (French/English) performance of *Un Canadien Errant*, a traditional Canadian folksong. Countertenor **David Pope** (RC of Abingdon, England) was the featured French-speaking soloist.



“We reviewed many pieces to sing, but in the end, the final selection was based on whether or not we had secured copyright permissions to perform the songs. We also wanted a good variety that reflected the object of Rotary.”

A performance favorite was Jay Althouse’s arrangement of Irv Rothenberg’s *We Can Build a Bridge*. The piece uniquely reflects RI President’s **Ray Klingensmith’s** theme this year. **Patty Wolfe** (RC of San Rafael,

CA, USA) was the featured soloist.

The Interfaith Service

The choir opened the Interfaith Service with the traditional Gaelic melody, *Morning Has Broken*. Following a welcome message by RI Foundation Trustee David D. Morgan, **Dr. Sharmishtha Desai** (RC of Baroda Metro, Gujarat, India) presented a reading from Hinduism. The choir then sang Joseph M. Martin’s *Canticle of Peace*, highlighted by soloist **Susan DuPree** (RC of Pleasanton North, CA, USA).

Guest Director **Andy Anderson** (RC of Wilmington Central, NC, USA), founder of the Rotary World Choir, then led the choir in Robert Van Horne’s *Our Rotary*. This tune was followed by readings from Judaism and Islam. Flautist **Ada Kahn** (RC of Evanston, IL, USA) accompanied the



choir in the *Hymn of Promise* and then was the featured instrumentalist for the Scottish folk song, *Loch Lomond*. *Un Canadien Errant* preceded readings from Buddhism and Christianity. *We Can Build a Bridge* and *Go with a Song in Your Heart* were followed by the moderator’s closing remarks. The congregation then joined the Rotary World Choir in singing *Let There Be Peace of Earth*.



Keeping the Beat...with the Benefits of Being an IFRM Member

Did you know that IFRM is one of 56 officially recognized Fellowships by Rotary International? Fellowships range from stamp collecting to yachting to bird watching to quilting and 52 others in between! Rotary Fellowships are groups of Rotarians, their spouses, and Rotaractors who share a common vocation, hobby or recreational interest.

IFRM is one of the oldest (1972) and one of the more active fellowships. The activities of IFRM are very visible in the Rotary world. One is singing in the Rotary World Choir at the Interfaith Service at Rotary international conventions. Another is staffing the very lively booth in the House of Friendship at conventions where we encourage musical merriment, sell Rotary songbooks, and promote recordings by IFRM members. Also, IFRM provides a talent bank of musicians for the many social events during the convention. IFRM members share their talent by performing on stage in the House of Friendship.

However, there is more to IFRM membership than these activities at conventions. We network on an interactive website. Members can ask questions, such as where to find a rare piece of music or a rare accompaniment to a composition. Members share their activities, seek advice, and even advertise job opportunities. Conversations go around the Rotary world, all centered on the vocation of music.

Membership also enables us to participate in uniquely musical service projects. IFRM provides aid and service through music. For example, members are proud that in the last few years IFRM has helped

reequip music departments in hurricane damaged schools in New Orleans and in Grenada, West Indies. IFRM participated in a matching grant project that set up a travelling library and music resource center for young children in the Philippines.

- Locate fellow musicians who share your interests by using the online directory of members
- Become involved in unique music-related service projects

- Help advance Rotary's goals of international understanding, goodwill and world peace...through music



- Accepted, with regret, the resignation of Membership Chair Peter Sotheran. He graciously agreed to mentor Ron Carey while he "learns the ropes".
- Thanked Past Chair and former Rotary World Choir Director Chungsam Doh for his many years as a member of the Board
- Approved the e-publication of a monthly e-bulletin to current members. Accepted Director Kahn's suggestion to call it *Staccato*.
- Approved the Treasurer's Report as submitted. Director Fivelstad wrote that all investments are properly secured now and both the Donor Advised Fund (DAF) and our securities' investments are stable. As of June 2, 2010, IFRM assets totaled \$40,124.97, an increase of \$4,981.95 over the previous year.
- Approved additional funds to assist in the updating of the IFRM website
- Director Reinhardt suggested that at future conventions it would be a good idea to have the IFRM booth close to a stage with a seating area as an alternate to main stage entertainment in the HoF.
- Outgoing Chair Susan DuPree was heartily thanked for her five years of service. Her vision and leadership resulted in moving IFRM forward.

Songs for Peace *George Barkett*

In 2008, I corresponded with IFRM Chair Dr. Susan DuPree to explore the possibility of working together. She suggested that I attend the Los Angeles Convention and meet with the IFRM Board to discuss collaborating on launching an annual international peace song writing contest.

It was a very warm, productive, and stimulating meeting. I was quite impressed with the intelligence, wisdom, and charm of the leadership of IFRM. I had really hoped that I would come away from the meeting with a commitment to form a working committee from the membership, with a powerful leader that would take this idea and run with it. Hopefully, I thought, I would continue to contribute in a small way by being part of the committee.

Dr Susan took my hand, and so very gently said that IFRM would love to help me--and would--but it would be much better for me to start the project locally, and then expand with IFRM's help. She said the leadership of IFRM would be happy to give me encouragement and support. I was very disappointed because in reality, I am retired, lazy, and did not want to work that hard.

I realized a short time later that she was absolutely right and that all the details and complexities of starting an international internet project would work best if I began with a local team that could meet and work together to move the project along.

Thanks to encouragement from Susan and Lee, we have come a long way! Our website, www.songsforpeace.net, is up and running and currently receiving 200,000+ hits a month. More than 40% of the visitors stay on the site for one hour or longer. When you Google the words "songs for peace," we are number nine out of more than 19 million entries.

Songs can be uploaded to our website. Registered viewers can vote for their favorite songs. We are planning to have a two-tier voting system so there will be public voting as well as non-biased musician voting. I would like the IFRM membership to be an integral part of the decision-making as to what is the best song for peace of the year. We haven't worked out the details as of yet because we are a work in progress. However, very soon the mechanics of the system will emerge.

We are looking forward to having a very strong relationship with IFRM for many years to come. We anticipate many new and wonderful songs for peace that will be sung for many years by Rotary clubs throughout the world. Thank you, IFRM, for all the wonderful contributions you make for Rotary and the entire world.

A Salute to Past Membership Chair, Peter Sotheran

When **Peter Sotheran** (RC of Guisborough & Great Ayton, England) joined the IFRM Board of Directors and became Membership Chair in 2007, the IFRM database was on an unpublished excel sheet. Other than the biannual publication of the IFRM newsletter *Music Notes*, there was no interactive forum where members could share comments or engage in on-line communication.

All that changed under the aegis of Peter. With the vision and support of then IFRM Chair **Susan DuPree** (RC of Pleasanton North, CA, USA), Peter worked with web architect **François Daoust** (RC of San Jose North,



CA, USA) and together they created an on-line Directory of Members with extensive search features. Additionally, Peter is solely responsible for getting the Yahoo Group up and running. Lastly, those of us who joined Peter in York on the After-Convention Tour from Birmingham, England, appreciated his time and energy in arranging the many memorable events and activities.

Peter's work with the 17th century Sir William Turner's almshouses in northern England earned him recognition from her majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. In June 2006, Peter was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in the Queen's Birthday Honors List.

More recently, Peter worked with Rotarians for Fighting AIDS (RFFA). He managed a health camp site in the slums of Nairobi and coordinated teams of medical, dental and optical clinicians, 70 international volunteers and 200 local Rotary and Rotaract volunteers. During their ten days of work, over 11,000 patients were screened and treated. It turned out to be the largest multi-disciplinary health mission ever mounted by Rotary in its 105 year history.

Peter served two successive years as President of the RC of Guisborough & Great Ayton. 


